Donald F. Schwarz, MD, MPH

Health Commissioner and Deputy Mayor for Health and Opportunity, City of Philadelphia

Before entering government service, Dr. Donald F. Schwarz was Vice Chairman of the Department of Pediatrics of the University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine and Deputy Physician-in-Chief and Craig-Dalsimer Division Chief for Adolescent Medicine at The Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. He was Professor of Pediatrics in the University of Pennsylvania Schools of Medicine and Nursing, and a senior fellow at the Leonard Davis Institute for Health Economics at Penn. Dr. Schwarz was an active researcher in the area of adolescent risk behaviors for over 22 years. He received both public and private funding for work that examined the issues of

injury and its prevention in urban, minority communities, public policy approaches to adolescent violence, and physician- and nurse-practice-based interventions to improve outcomes for high-risk infants

Gary D. Foster, PhD

Director, Center for Obesity Research and Education

Laura H. Carnell Professor of Medicine, Public Health and Psychology, Temple University

Dr. Foster's research interests include the prevention and treatment of obesity. He studies a variety of treatment approaches including behavior therapy, pharmacotherapy, and surgery. He evaluates obesity prevention strategies in schools and communities. Some of his current research studies include: the effects of weight loss on sleep apnea, the role of school breakfast in preventing childhood obesity and the effects of changing the environment in corner stores and supermarkets in low-income areas. He has authored or coauthored more than 150 scientific publications and 3 books on obesity.



Brian Lang, MGA

Director, Supermarket Campaign, The Food Trust

Mr. Lang works to improve everyone's access to affordable nutritious food. Recently, he has worked with state and local governments in New York, Illinois, New Jersey and Colorado to advocate for and develop policies that bring supermarkets to underserved communities. Prior to that Mr. Lang managed a network of 30 farmers' markets (many in low and moderate income communities) throughout Southeastern Pennsylvania that serve over 1 million area residents each year. Mr. Lang also serves as a consultant on behalf of the Trust, analyzing and evaluating public markets, and leading seminars about state and municipal food policy.
