

### LOI for Pilot Research Grants, Innovative Cores Due Oct. 22

The [CCTST Pilot Translational Research and Innovative Core Grant Program](#) will provide up to \$60,000 for projects by established principal investigators, or by mentored new/early stage investigators, focused on applying discoveries generated during research in the laboratory, and in pre-clinical studies, to the development of trials and studies in humans. The Program will also provide up to \$50,000 for the establishment of new, innovative cores with a clear translational focus.

Interdisciplinary and cross-institutional collaborations are encouraged. **Letter of intent (LOI) deadline is Thursday, October 22 before midnight.** Invited applications are due December 19.

### Science of Team Science Seminar October 19

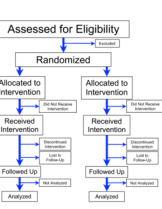
