The CCTST Just-In-Time (JIT) grant mechanism enables investigators to use participating UC or CCHMC core facilities to obtain critical preliminary data for submission of a competitive extramural proposal, patent application or commercialization agreement.

Investigators may apply for up to \$7,500 annually. Next deadline is October 1.
