

Community Leaders Institute, Health Grant Deadlines



The **Community Leaders Institute (CLI)** is an 8 session leadership development and training program offered over 5 weeks in February-March 2017. Training sessions are designed to build leadership and research/program evaluation skills in the following areas: Grant Writing; Accessing Public Datasets; Program Evaluation; Quality Improvement; Survey Development & Assessing Community Health Needs; Design Thinking; Research Ethics. The **Community Health Grant** program offers grants of up to \$20,000 for translational research conducted by academic and community organizations/programs or physician practices that improve outcomes in children, adults, and/or the community. The **Partnership Development Grant** program offers grants of up to \$5,000 focused on the development or strengthening of collaborations between community and academic partners. For both grants, an optional letter of intent was due November 11. Final proposals are due **January 9, 2017**. [Read more](#)

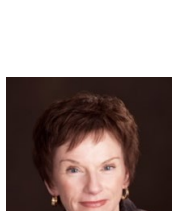
ATRN Health Summit a Success!

2016 Holiday Drive: Donate By December 21



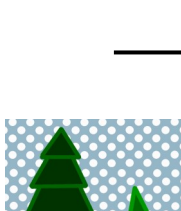
Get into the holiday spirit by donating health and wellness items for participants in Hamilton County Developmental Disabilities Services' community integration projects.
