August 15: [Processes and Methods Pilot Grant Program](#)

Enables investigators at all levels to explore ways to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of the processes and methods used in clinical and translational research. Grants awarded in this cycle will provide seed funds of up to \$5,000 for developing a long-term (2 to 5 year) research proposal focused on advancing specific processes and/or methods deemed important to clinical and translational research.

Awardees will have 4 months to produce a more complete 6-page research proposal with an estimated budget not to exceed \$40,000/year in direct costs.

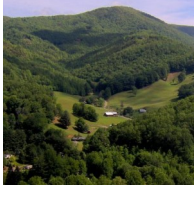
August 23: [Appalachian Community-Academic Partner Program](#)

Up to \$100,000 available as a 2-year pilot grant to strengthen or support development of sustainable partnerships between academic researchers and community stakeholders for translational research addressing health disparities in Appalachia.

November 1: [Clinical Research Feasibility Fund \(CRFF\)](#)

Up to \$20,000 for junior faculty on a clinical research career path who are utilizing substantive resources of the [Schubert Research Clinic](#) for pilot studies. Approved protocol required.

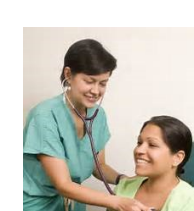


Latino Health Summit Small Project Grants Available
