

Just-in-Time Grant Deadline February 1

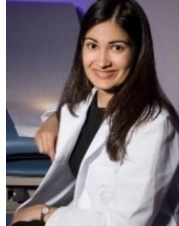


The CCTST Just-In-Time grant mechanism enables investigators to use participating UC or CCHMC core facilities to obtain critical preliminary data for submission of a competitive extramural proposal, patent application or commercialization agreement.

Offered three times annually, the program's next deadline is February 1. Maximum award is \$7,500.

Design Thinking Research Award LOI Due March 27

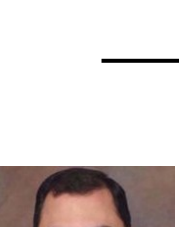

The program provides up to \$10,000 in support toward a semester-long studio project in which a design-led multidisciplinary team of UC faculty and students works with investigators to address a health care challenge. The PI must be a CCHMC faculty member; collaboration with faculty based at UC and the Cincinnati VAMC is encouraged.

Global Health Seminar January 26

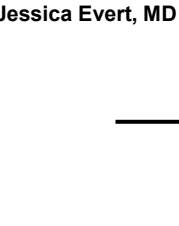
